

<p>Burnable waste (mixed waste)</p> <p>In principle, all non-recyclable waste for which no recycling container is reserved is placed in burnable waste.</p>	<p>Burnable waste includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • dirty plastics, styrofoam, toys • ash after cooling, packed tightly in a bag (cooling for 2 days) • shoes, rubber, leather • hygiene products, sanitary towels, nappies, make-up • vacuum cleaner bags • chewing gums, cigarette ends • PVC (Recycling label 3, such as pipes, hoses, electrical cables, plastic floor coverings) • non-recyclable textiles • coffee bags, potato crisps packaging • foam rubber • dirty or wet cardboard and paper
<p>Glass</p> <p>Glass collection is intended for glass used in packaging only.</p> <p>Remove the metal caps and lids. Paper labels do not need to be removed. Rinse the dirty bottles and jars. Return the deposit bottles back to the store.</p>	<p>Recyclable glass includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • glass jars • glass bottles <p>The following materials do not belong in the glass collection:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • car windows, window glass • glassware with metal parts • ceramics, porcelain, crystal • heat-resistant glass, insulating glass • incandescent light bulbs, fluorescent lamps, energy-saving light bulbs • mirrors
<p>Metal</p> <p>Carefully empty the container and remove any plastic parts. To save space, the packaging can be flattened or stacked</p>	<p>Recyclable metal includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • cans, metal jars • aluminium tins and aluminium foil • small objects made of metal, such as cooking pots • metallic lids, crown caps and screw caps • non-deposit beverage cans • paint cans when completely empty
<p>Cardboard</p> <p>Return cardboard packaging empty, clean, dry, flattened or stacked. Remove plastic caps from the packaging.</p>	<p>Recyclable cardboard includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • milk, juice, cream, buttermilk, yoghurt and wine containers (including containers lined with aluminium) • cereal and cookie packaging, paper bags for food • cardboard boxes, pizza boxes, egg cartons and disposable containers made of cardstock
<p>Plastic packaging materials</p> <p>You can put empty, clean and dry plastic packaging materials in the plastics collection. Caps, lids and</p>	<p>Plastic packaging material includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • plastic packaging of foodstuffs, such as yoghurt containers, butter containers, packaging of cold cuts, cheese and ready-made meals, and dry plastic packaging

<p>similar must be removed and placed separately in the collection container. Packages made of different types of plastic should not be stacked.</p> <p>Plastic recycling points in Jämsä:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citymarket Jämsä • S-market Jämsä • S-market Jämsänkoski 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • detergent, shampoo and soap containers • plastic bottles, cannisters and jars - preferably flattened • plastic bags and wrappers • coffee packaging and crisps bags <p>The following materials do not belong in the recycling of plastic packaging:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • dirty plastic packaging or mixed waste • buckets, toys, etc. • PVC packaging (Recycling label 3) • plastic film • plastic packaging containing hazardous material
<p>Biowaste</p> <p>Biowaste consists of bio-degradable food and kitchen waste that decomposes.</p>	<p>Biowaste includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • food waste • peel of fruit, root and vegetables • tea and coffee grounds with filter bags • egg shells, fish offal, bones • kitchen paper, napkins • potting soil and plant waste • a newspaper spread or a paper bag <p>The following should not be placed in the recycling or compost bin:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • materials that do not decay, such as plastics, glasses, metals • ash or lime • cigarette ends, vacuum cleaner bags
