

<p><b>Burnable waste (mixed waste)</b></p> <p>In principle, all non-recyclable waste for which no recycling container is reserved is placed in burnable waste.</p>	<p><b>Burnable waste includes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• dirty plastics, styrofoam, toys</li> <li>• ash after cooling, packed tightly in a bag (cooling for 2 days)</li> <li>• shoes, rubber, leather</li> <li>• hygiene products, sanitary towels, nappies, make-up</li> <li>• vacuum cleaner bags</li> <li>• chewing gums, cigarette ends</li> <li>• PVC (Recycling label 3, such as pipes, hoses, electrical cables, plastic floor coverings)</li> <li>• non-recyclable textiles</li> <li>• coffee bags, potato crisps packaging</li> <li>• foam rubber</li> <li>• dirty or wet cardboard and paper</li> </ul>
<p><b>Glass</b></p> <p>Glass collection is intended for glass used in packaging only.</p> <p>Empty bottles and jars. Remove the metal caps and lids. Paper labels do not need to be removed. Return the deposit bottles back to the store.</p>	<p><b>Recyclable glass includes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• glass jars</li> <li>• glass bottles</li> </ul> <p><b>The following materials do not belong in the glass collection:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• car windows, window glass</li> <li>• glassware with metal parts</li> <li>• ceramics, porcelain, crystal</li> <li>• heat-resistant glass, insulating glass</li> <li>• incandescent light bulbs, fluorescent lamps, energy-saving light bulbs</li> <li>• mirrors</li> </ul>
<p><b>Metal</b></p> <p>Carefully empty the container and remove any plastic parts. To save space, the packaging can be flattened or stacked.</p>	<p><b>Recyclable metal includes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• cans, metal jars</li> <li>• aluminium tins and aluminium foil</li> <li>• small objects made of metal, such as cooking pots</li> <li>• metallic lids, crown caps and screw caps</li> <li>• non-deposit beverage cans</li> <li>• paint cans when completely empty</li> </ul>
<p><b>Cardboard</b></p> <p>Return cardboard packaging empty, clean, dry, flattened or stacked. Remove plastic caps from the packaging.</p>	<p><b>Recyclable cardboard includes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• milk, juice, cream, buttermilk, yoghurt and wine containers (including containers lined with aluminium)</li> <li>• cereal and cookie packaging, paper bags for food</li> <li>• cardboard boxes, pizza boxes, egg cartons and disposable containers made of cardstock</li> </ul>
<p><b>Plastic packaging materials</b></p> <p>You can put empty packaging materials in the plastics collection. Caps, lids and</p>	<p><b>Plastic packaging material includes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• plastic packaging of foodstuffs, such as yoghurt containers, butter containers, packaging of cold cuts, cheese and ready-made meals, and dry plastic packaging</li> </ul>

<p>similar must be removed and placed separately in the collection container. Packages made of different types of plastic should not be stacked.</p> <p>Plastic recycling points in Jämsä:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Citymarket Jämsä</li> <li>• S-market Jämsä</li> <li>• S-market Jämsänkoski</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• detergent, shampoo and soap containers</li> <li>• plastic bottles, cannisters and jars - preferably flattened</li> <li>• plastic bags and wrappers</li> <li>• coffee packaging and crisps bags</li> </ul> <p><b>The following materials do not belong in the recycling of plastic packaging:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• dirty plastic packaging or mixed waste</li> <li>• buckets, toys, etc.</li> <li>• PVC packaging (Recycling label 3)</li> <li>• plastic film</li> <li>• plastic packaging containing hazardous material</li> </ul>
<p><b>Biowaste</b></p> <p>Biowaste consists of bio-degradable food and kitchen waste that decomposes.</p>	<p><b>Biowaste includes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• food waste</li> <li>• peel of fruit, root and vegetables</li> <li>• tea and coffee grounds with filter bags</li> <li>• egg shells, fish offal, bones</li> <li>• kitchen paper, napkins</li> <li>• potting soil and plant waste</li> <li>• a newspaper spread or a paper bag</li> </ul> <p><b>The following should not be placed in the recycling or compost bin:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• materials that do not decay, such as plastics, glasses, metals</li> <li>• ash or lime</li> <li>• cigarette ends, vacuum cleaner bags</li> </ul>
