Combustible waste:	Combustible waste includes:
Almost all non-recyclable, combustible waste for which no collection container is reserved should be sorted into combustible waste. (PLEASE NOTE! Metal	Recyclable metal includes:
Carefully empty the container and remove any plastic parts. Recyclable cardboard	Recyclable cardboard includes:
Return cardboard packaging empty, clean, dry, flattened and placed inside each other.	 milk, juice, cream, buttermilk, yoghurt and wine containers (including containers lined with aluminium)
Remove plastic caps from the packaging.	 cereal and biscuit packaging, bags for sugar, flour and bread and other paper bags cardboard boxes, pizza boxes, egg cartons disposable containers made of cardstock.

Waste to be delivered to a waste treatment centre:

- drinking glasses, glassware, glass sheets, crystal
- heat-resistant glass (glass cookware, coffee pots)
- porcelain, ceramics
- mirrors
- incandescent light bulbs, halogen lamps
- construction waste
- hazardous waste
- electronic waste

You can deliver 50 litres of waste to a waste treatment centre for free. If you want to deliver more, you will have to pay a fee according to a price list. Private persons can always deliver hazardous waste and electronic waste to waste treatment centres for free.
